

Creative Curriculum Theme – Pharaohs History

- Research Ancient Egypt and the key events and people of this time, placing them in chronological order on a timeline.
- Use artefacts to explore the key roles of the Ancient Egyptians.
- Learn about the earliest achievements of the Egyptians and draw conclusions about the impact they have had on modern day life.

Art

- Research Egyptian designers and artists and use their work as inspiration.

DT

- Research, design and bake Egyptian flatbreads and explain what time of year foods are in season.

Geography

- Use maps and atlases to locate Egypt and explore neighbouring countries.
- Use a range of different sources to find out about the physical and human characteristics of Egypt.

English

Text: 'Stories from Ancient Egypt' by Julian Heath

- Identify language and structural features from a variety of short stories.
- Select appropriate descriptive language to write a short fantasy story set in Ancient Egypt.
- Identify and magpie persuasive vocabulary.
- Use persuasive language and structural features in a text encouraging tourists to visit Egypt.
- Use modal verbs to indicate degrees of possibility in our writing.

Maths

- Solve problems involving fractions.
- Understand angles as measures of a turn, and use a protractor to accurately measure angles.
- Calculate missing angles on a straight line and in a rectangle.
- Divide a 4-digit number by a 1 or 2 digit number using a written method.

Physical Activity

Dance and gymnastics

- Use a sequence of movements to create an atmosphere or tell a story.
- Create bridges using different parts of the body.

Forest School:

- Work together in to achieve a common goal, whilst using tools and keeping safe.

- Talk about clothes and give opinions about our likes and dislikes.

Read an ancient Egyptian myth – retell the story or create a storyboard of the story.

Create a quiz about ancient Egypt for the class to take part in.

Reading

Children are encouraged to read throughout the week (their chosen text from Accelerated Reader Programme). Home school link books must be brought every day so that teachers can see the time they are spending reading at home.

In school, children will then be given a quiz on their chosen book so that class teacher's can see their understanding of the text.
