## English

We will focus on non-fiction texts. We will read : 'Mighty Trucks', 'Speedy Trains', 'Fast Cars' and 'Spectacular Ships' by Sarah Snashall and Anthony Hannant.

Continue to use 'Talk For Writing' to develop a rich and varied vocabulary.

Write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others.

In phonics children will revisit 42 phonemes and continue to learn and apply alternative graphemes.

# Maths

- We will focus on recognising, ordering and counting with numbers 11-20
- Children will solve problems using doubling, halving and sharing.
- We will continue to develop mathematical knowledge of subtraction and addition.

## **Physical Development**

- Children will take part in dance sessions on Wednesday afternoons.
- Continue to develop gross motor skills during outdoor play.

## **Communication and Language**

- Children will develop skills to express themselves effectively, showing awareness of listeners' needs.
- Children will learn to use past, present and future forms accurately.

### Music

- Use instruments to explore and create different sounds related to vehicles.
- Learn and rehearse Easter songs.
