- WORLD WAR II ENDS!
- Research how and when WW2 ended.

 Make short and concise notes, making sure you note down all of the key points who, what, when, where and why. Then use this information to:
 - Write a newspaper article announcing the end of the war to the British public. Remember to have a catchy headline, a 5 W's paragraph to open and incorporate quotes (correctly punctuated " ").
 - Write a short radio speech announcing the end of the war. Remember to keep it short and to the point. Only include the key facts.

Grammar and Spelling

- Practise words containing the spelling pattern:
 ei/ie. (e.g achieve, ceiling...)
- Find synonyms (words with the same meaning)
 and antonyms (words with the opposite
 meaning) for the following words: courteous,
 bellow, humble, obstinate.

Year 6

Maths

- Draw a range of quadrilaterals (4 sided shapes). Practise using a ruler to accurately measure the sides..
- Draw (draw around objects or use a compass) a range of different size circles. Label the radius, diameter and circumference. Then calculate the radius and diameter. Remember diameter is twice the length of the radius.
- Revise prime numbers, factors and multiples. Create a Venn diagram or Carroll diagram to present them.



Reading

- Find and read a poem (from a book or from the internet) - practise performing and/or reading the poem aloud using expression.
- Write the definition of two new or unusual words from the poem.
- In one sentence, summarise what the poem is about. Remember when summarising to only include the important information.

Creative - WWII

- Listen to two WW2 war songs (eg. 't's a Long Way to Tipperrary' and 'Keep the Home Fires Burning' - compare the two songs and think carefully about their purpose and impact.
- Find out about VE Day create a presentation or fact sheet about it.
- Plan and design a 'street party' to mark the end of the Second World War - think about the decorations, food and music you would have.
- Create a timeline of the key events that happening during WW2.
