- Is the Iron Man a good or a bad character? Write a paragraph to explain what you think, using information from the text to justify your views.
- Draw and label a 'before and after' diagram of the Iron Man. Start by drawing the Iron Man at the top of the cliff using the description at the beginning of the chapter to help you. Then draw a picture to show the Iron Man after the fall. Use evidence from the text to carefully label both diagrams.
- Be a 'Word Detective' and search for examples of powerful verbs in Chapter 1. Some good examples are 'toppling' and 'tumbling'. See how many you can find. Can you sort them into verbs that describe activity and verbs that describe stillness?



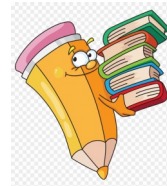
Maths

- Can you find out the perimeter of different objects in your house. Choose one side of the object to measure it as a 2-D shape. Record in your book.
- Write when you start and finish an activity to one-minute intervals. You can record this to see if it changes each day.
- Write down where you can find right angles in your home. Record this in a table. You can add photos or drawings.

- How many words can you think of with the suffixes -ness, -ment or -ful? Present your findings in a table. Remember to check you have spelt each word correctly.
- Use the words you have found with the suffixes to create some interesting sentences.
- Read a short book (you can choose an accelerated reader book or any other book) and write a review. Would you recommend it to your friends? What was your favourite part? What part did you not like?
