

- Write a story (aim for at least 2 pages) that involves a detective solving a mystery. Where will your story be based? What is the mystery? Who are the main characters? How will they solve the mystery? *Remember your sentence types (2A, 3A, BOBS, exclamations, commands)*.
- Write a set of instructions to direct someone from one place to another. You can talk about things they might see on the way to make sure they are on track.
- Draw a scene of one of your favourite places: the beach, a park, holiday, swimming pool, theme park. Then write a description of the scene using lots of exciting adjectives. You could even add some similes!



- Read aloud to an adult, putting on different voices for each character.
- Write some interview questions for a character in your book to find out more about them.
- Write a book review about the book you've just read; would you recommend it to a friend?

## <u>Maths</u>

- Practise the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.
- Compare numbers using < > = symbols
- Find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money (try and use some coins from home to help).
- Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.
- Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement, including movement in a straight line and distinguishing between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles for quarter, half and three-quarter turns (clockwise and anticlockwise).




## **<u>Creative - Street Detectives</u>**

- Research how Wombourne has changed over time. Compare homes, jobs and clothes past and present.
- Show community spirit by helping a family member e.g. do their shopping, wash their car, weed their garden.
- Draw a plan, map or create a model of your ideal neighbourhood. Who would you like living on your street? What amenities would your residents need (for example, Rapunzel might need a hairdresser).

Look in detail at the outside of your own house and make a careful observational drawing.

Make a leaflet or short film about the local community.
