English

- Use the Internet to research the history of Wombourne. Create an information text or fact file.
- Write a short story about something that interests you. Remember to try
 to create suspense and tension by using different punctuation and
 sentence types.

Grammar and Spelling

- Practise the Year 5 and 6 spellings.
- Practise words containing the spelling pattern ei/ie, e.g achieve, ceiling. Remember the exception words e.g. weird.
- Practise using inverted commas around spoken words. Write a conversation between multiple characters.

<u>Maths</u>

- Revise the written method for multiplication e.g. Th H T O x O or Th H T O x TO.
- Write your own multiplication problems and see if your parents/carers can solve them correctly.
- Practise drawing and describing a range of 2D shapes e.g. an
 isosceles triangle. Remember to use mathematical vocabulary to
 describe the angles, parallel or perpendicular sides and the
 length of the sides.
- Complete the statistics activities on Purple Mash. Don't forget to 'hand in' when completed.



- Find and read a poem (from a book or from the internet) - practise performing and/or reading the poem aloud using expression.
- Write the definition of two new or unusual words from the poem.
- In one sentence, summarise what the poem is about. Remember when summarising to only include the important information.
