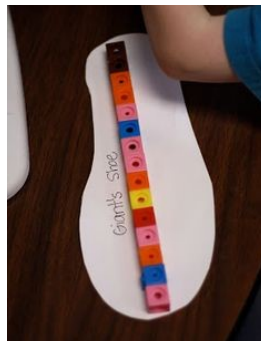


## Phonics/Reading Opportunities

- Read a new story, stop half way through and think about what might happen next!
- Practise writing the letters of your name, have a go at sounding out each letter as you write.

- Answer questions related to the story, Jack and the beanstalk: e.g. Would you go up the beanstalk? What would you do? Why?

## Maths Opportunities

- Goldilocks and the three bears—explore small, medium and large objects—Can you sort or order them?
- Measure a giant's footprint using blocks or counters
- Roll a ball back and forth with a grown up or brother/sister—count how many rolls you do. How high can you count?
- Goldilocks broke baby bear's chair—Use construction blocks to make a new chair for baby bear.



## Get creative

- Make teddy toast using different spreads and toppings.
- Move to music—how does it make you feel? Can you come up with your own dance moves?
- Make a crown for a King/prince/queen or princess.
- Make a rainbow pizza! Think of different coloured toppings you could use.



## Get outdoors

- Create a piece of leaf art. What will it be? An animal? A monster? A house?
- Have a running race as The Gingerbread Man—can anyone catch you?
- Make a car wash for your toy cars or help a grown up to wash the car .
