


#### Is Stan correct?

- 1) Yes he could buy 2 drumsticks and have 10p left over or he could buy 3 drumsticks and have 0p left
  - 2) Jay's number is 7 because 15 8 = 7.



#### Answers:

- 1) Stan is correct. He can make these numbers: 34, 35, 43, 45, 53, 54.
  - 2) There could be 17 or 19. The clue says 'some more' swim into the cave, which means more than one.
