

## English

- Read the first chapter of The Lost Myth of Mathos on Purple Mash.
- Test your knowledge of the chapter by answering the brain-busting questions on Purple Mash.
- In this chapter there was a torrential storm. Write a list of all the sights and sounds that you experience in a storm. Can you think of some similes to describe the thunder, rain or lightning? Use your ideas to write a poem about a storm. You could use the activity My Storm Poem on Purple Mash to present your work.
- Find the Gods and Goddesses Activity on Purple Mash. Can you identify the missing letters to score points in this game?



## Spelling & Reading

- Use the read, cover, write strategy to learn the words: address, circle, experiment, imagine, occasion, promise and therefore.
- Practise these spelling by putting them into interesting sentences.
- Read aloud to an adult, putting on different voices for each character.
- After reading to an adult, ask them questions about what you have read.



## Maths

- Try sharing and dividing objects at home, asking yourself key questions.

E.g.


### **Sharing:**

*We have 6 strawberries to share between 2 of us. How many will each of us get?*

### **Grouping**

Try decorating fairy cakes:

*We have 12 chocolate buttons. Each cake needs 3 buttons. Put the buttons into groups of 3 to see how many cakes we can decorate.*



## Creative - Gods and Mortals

- **Be an archaeologist.** Use the **Ancient Greek Archaeologist activity on Purple Mash to find out about life in Ancient Greece using the art work found on vases from that time.**
- **Be inspired by Greek art!** Use the examples of **Ancient Greek pottery to create a design for an ancient Greek jug or bowl.** You could choose a scene from **Greek mythology to represent in your artwork or maybe another familiar story.** Remember to use colours typical of Greek art, such as black, white, red and yellow.
