- Write a list of teddies names.
- Make a card for a friend you miss.
- Re-write your favourite story. Can you include story language?

- With help, make a family tree back to your great grandparents.

- Write a sentence about your family and pets.
- Play I spy and write down what you can see.

## Phonics and Reading

- Use your Oxford Owl login to read a book.
- Practise your letter formation. If you have a tablet , you could try using purple mash 2handwrite to have go at forming your graphemes with lead ins.
- Play 'Simon Says' and sound out the word e.g. "Simon says touch your f-ee-t."
- Practise your tricky words.



## Maths

- Make a new version of "The very hungry caterpillar" with a new number of fruits eaten. Draw the pictures.
- Fill up 3 cups showing "empty, half full and full".
- Line up your shoes – how many pairs do you have? You will need to count in 2's.
- Count and write down how many forks and knives you have in the house.

## Creative - The rainforest.

- Task 1- Listen to the story Rumble in the Jungle <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=D2-01LkCzpM> Find out about the rainforest. What is it like there? Find out 3 things you would see in the rainforest, draw a picture of these and label it.
- Task 2 - Why are rainforests important? (e.g. Home to rare animals) Why are they in danger? Create a 'save the rainforest' poster?
- Task 3 - What animals can you find in the rainforest. Make a mask of an animal that lives there.
- Task 4 - What does it look like in the rainforest? What colours would you see? Paint a watercolour picture of the rainforest.
- Task 5 - What food comes from the rainforest? Can you find a recipe using this, see if you can make it.
