- Write a list of things you find in space.
- Make a space picture, label it and send it to friend.
- Imagine you can travel to space. Write about how you would travel to visit different planets.

- Write your own story about travelling to space.



Phonics and Reading

- Ask your grown up to write some alien (nonsense) words for you to sound out and blend using your phonics. E.g, rom, dup, lomf, shimk
- Use your Oxford Owl login to read a book.
- Practise your letter formation. If you have a tablet, you could try using purple mash 2handwrite to have go at forming your graphemes with lead ins.
- Practise your tricky words.



Maths

- Play doubles! Roll a dice to give you a number. Find the right number of objects, then double it!
- Find some objects with different masses from around your home. Compare their weights using "lighter" and "heavier." Can you order three or four objects from lightest to heaviest?
- Draw a number line with numbers 1-20. you can draw it on paper or on the ground with chalk outside. Practise counting forwards and backwards, touching each number as you say them.

- Task 1- Listen to the story 'Whatever Next' <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6c5cb0u0rPM> Design or make your own rocket using boxes and objects from around your home.
- Task 2 - Who is Tim Peake? What is his job? Find out and write a sentence about him.
- Task 3 - what does an astronaut do when they are in space? What do they eat? How do they keep clean and healthy? Find out!
- Task 4 - Choose a planet from our solar system. Draw a picture of it and write some labels to say if it is a hot or cold, wet or dry place?
- Task 5 - Are aliens real? You can make up your own! How many eyes does it have? What language does it speak? Send us your ideas!
