Phonics: All about the letter **p**

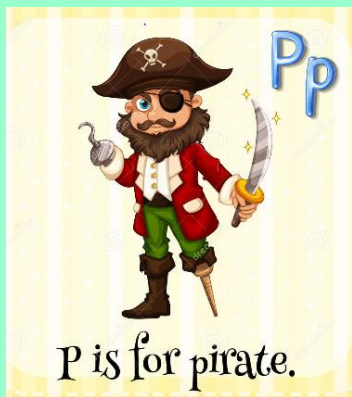
Learning objective:

- Say the sound like a pirate.
- Write the sound with your sword.

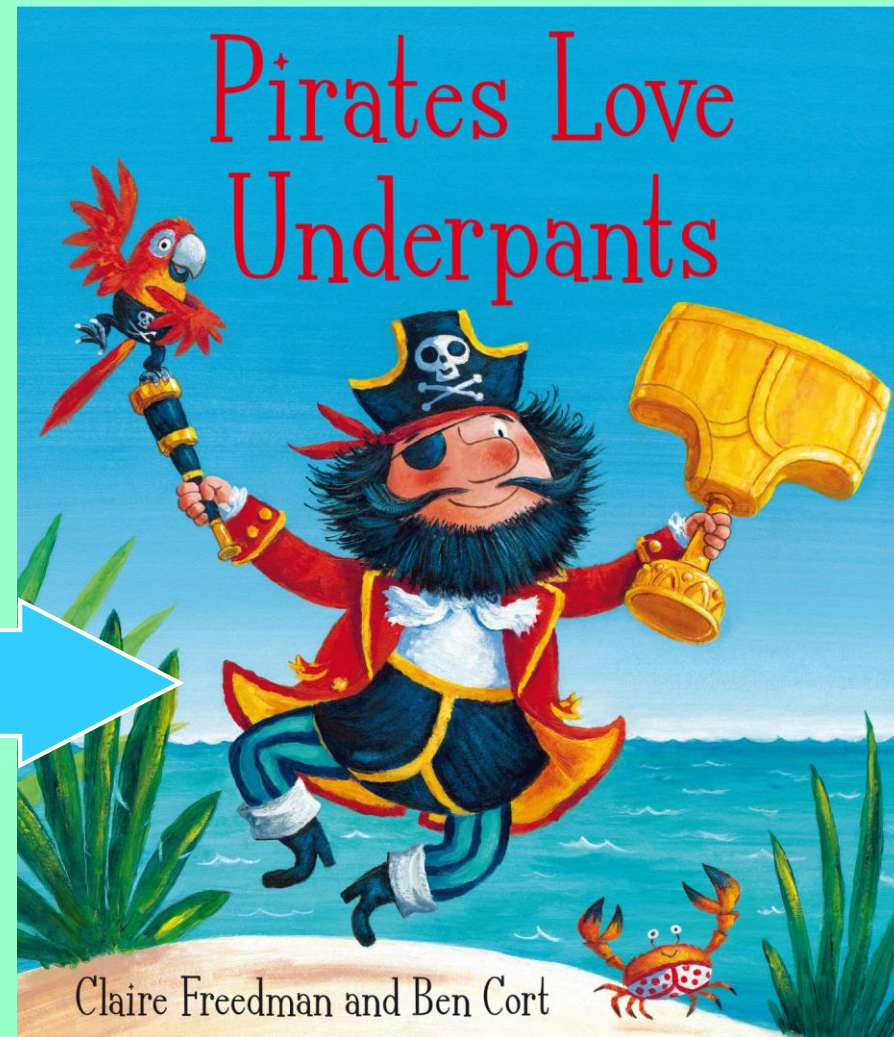


Monday

Learning objective:
To count objects to 10.

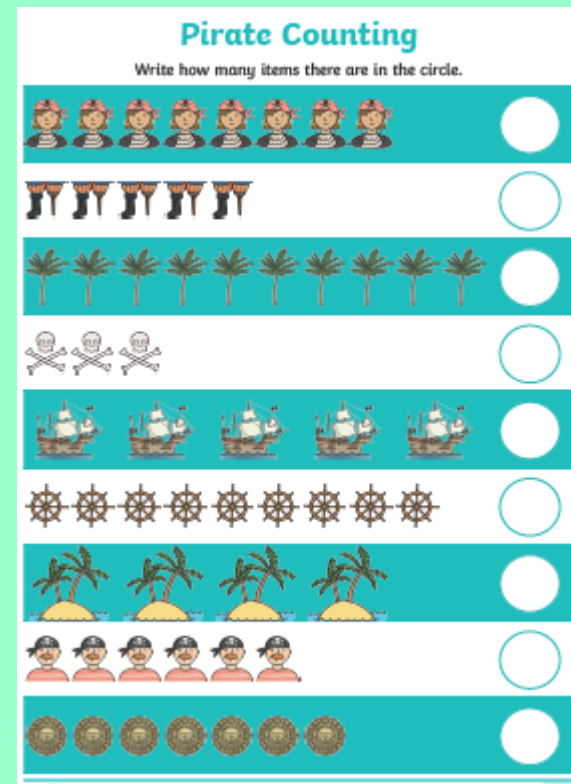
Steps to success:

- Count the items on the pirate worksheet.
- Encourage a simple guess before counting.
- Record answers.
- Develop counting skills using the underwater counting activity.
- Count them carefully by touching each one as you say number names in order.

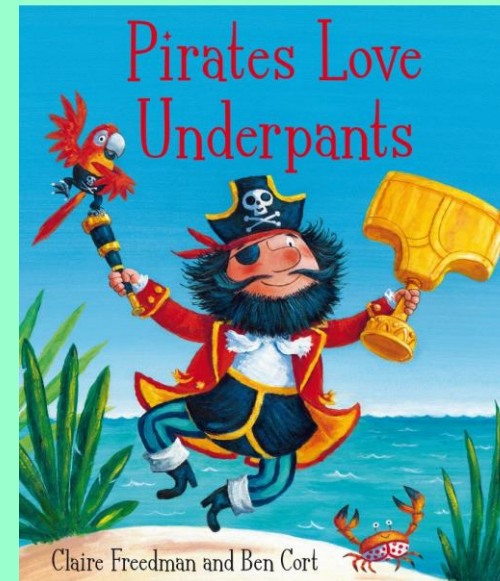
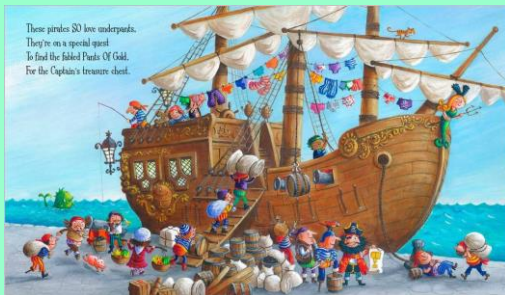

Learning objective:
Follow simple instructions to create a pirate hat.

Steps to success:

- Click on the pirate hat to see how to make a simple paper pirate hat.
- Have a go at making one.
- Decorate your hat using paint or collage.
- Make a skull and cross bones for the front of the hat.
- Demonstrate your best pirate voice.

Recognise and find things that begin with the sound **f**.

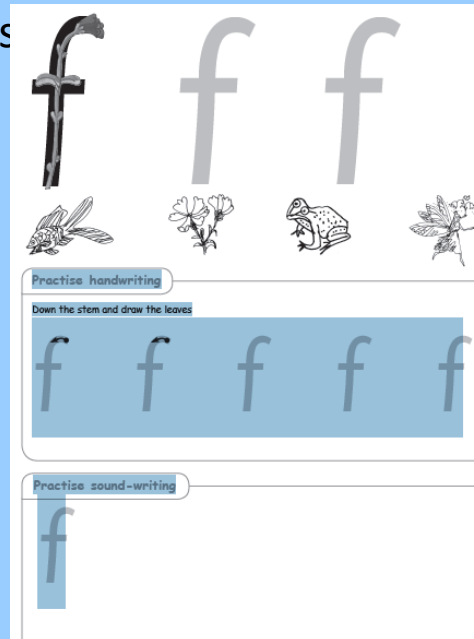
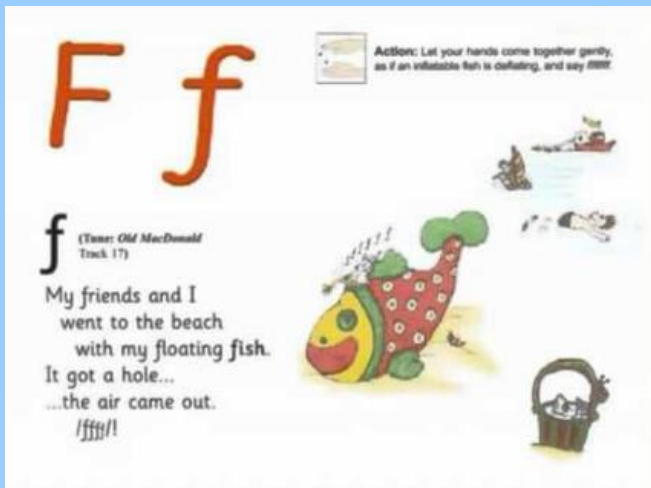
Tuesday

Steps to success:

- Listen to the Jolly Phonics song
- Draw the letter shape in the air with your finger
- Read the words on the worksheet. Listen carefully to the individual sounds.
- Write the letter **f** multiple times on paper using different pens
- Write letters with your finger in sand, salt or other materials.

Maths: Counting and matching amounts to numerals

Learning objective:

Recognise the number and count out the correct amount

Steps to success:

- Watch the video to reinforce counting techniques.
- Count the objects one by one.
- Stop when you get to the number you need.
- Record the number on the worksheet.

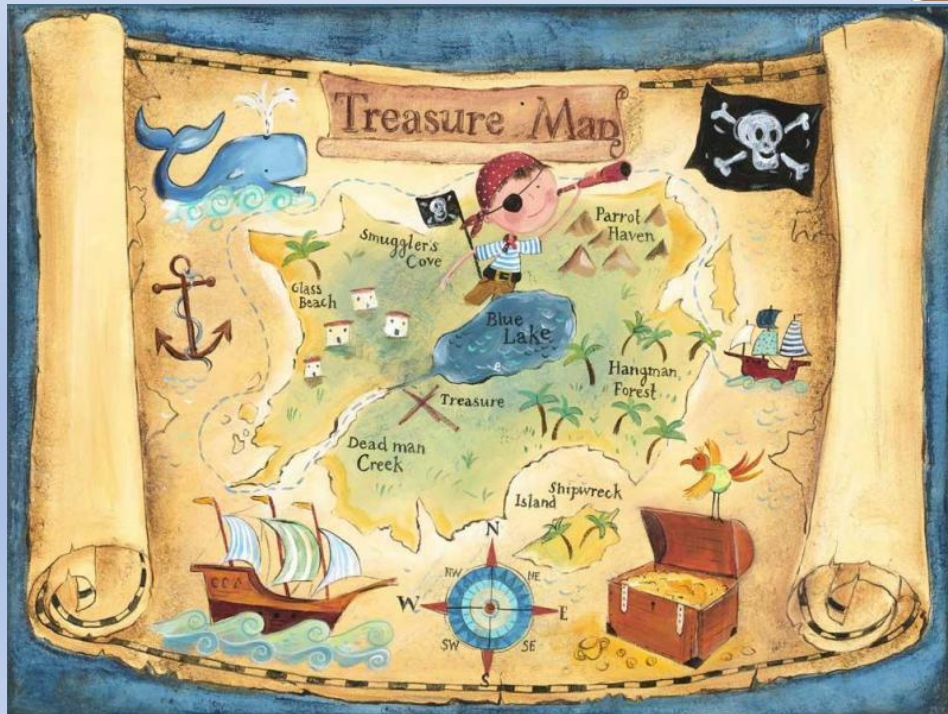
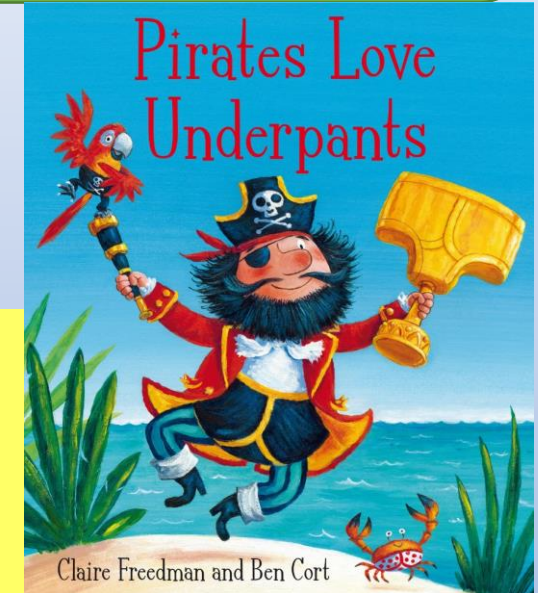
Creative: To make your own treasure map.

- See whether someone in your family can follow your map.



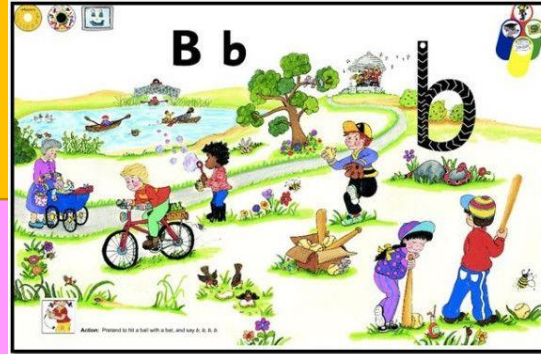
Wednesday

Action: Pretend to hit a ball with a bat, and say *b, b, b, b.*

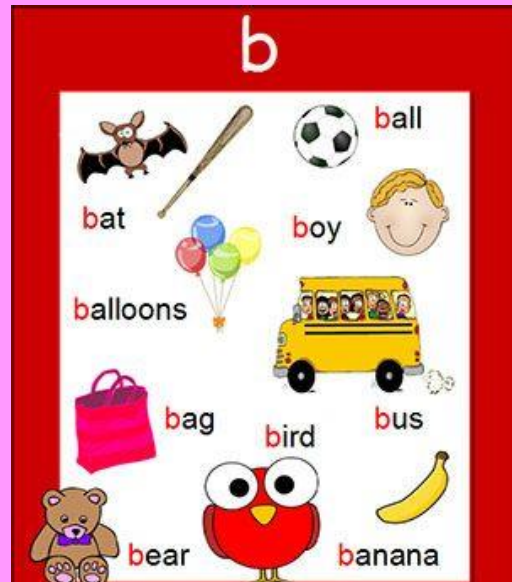

Maths: Number Hunt.

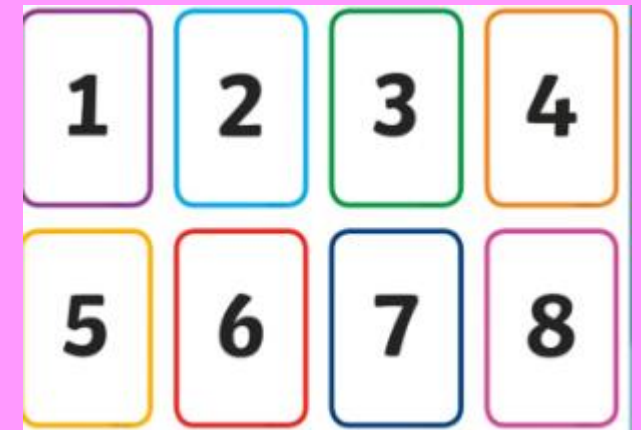
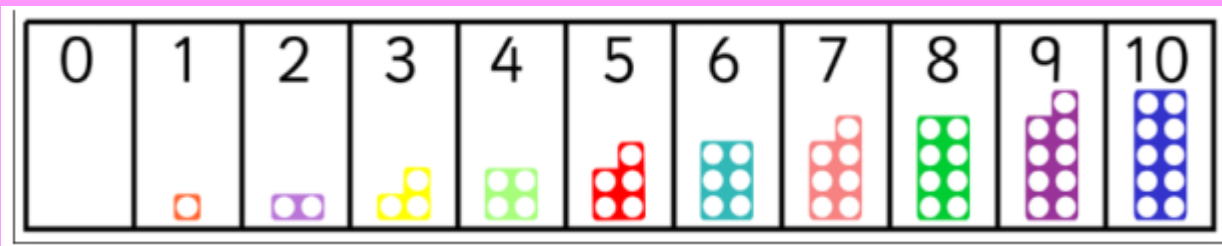
Learning objective:

Recognise numbers in the environment.

Steps to success:

- Look for numbers around the house.
- Write numbers or print off numbers from Twinkl and set up a treasure hunt inside or in the garden.
- Find the numbers, say the numbers and if you can write the numbers.

CHALLENGE: Make some larger numbers using natural objects as in the picture opposite.



Creative: Make your own treasure chest.

Learning objective:

Use recyclable materials to create a desired effect.

Steps to success:

- Find a container to transform into a treasure chest. (Egg boxes make great treasure boxes).
- Decorate your box with paint and other available resources.
- When dry, collect your treasure.



When you have made your treasure chest can you collect some precious treasure from around the house.

Thursday

Phonics: All about the letter j

Learning objective:

Recognise the letter j and say the sound it makes correctly.

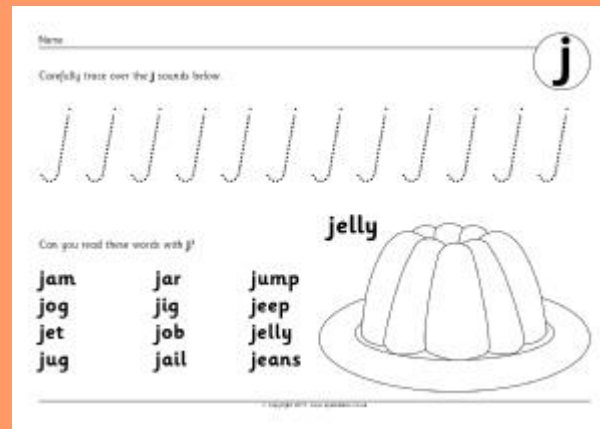
Recognise and find things that begin with the sound j.

Steps to success:

- Listen to the Jolly Phonics song: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=boXUMOlw5Ow>
- Draw the letter shape in the air with your finger
- Play 'I spy' with the letter j by saying words that begin with the j sound
- Find the letter j in a word in a book or a magazine

CHALLENGE: have a go at writing what your picture is, starting with the letter j e.g. jam

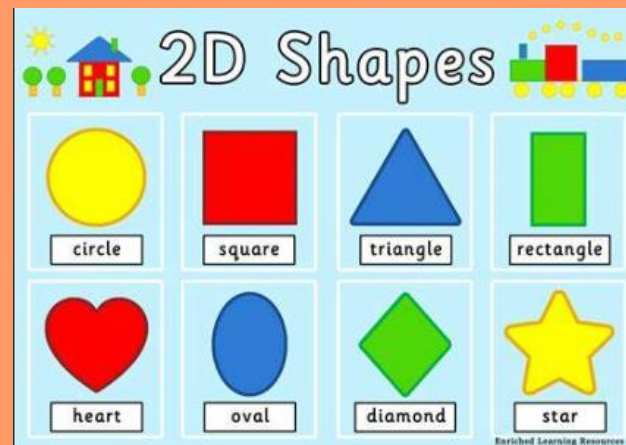
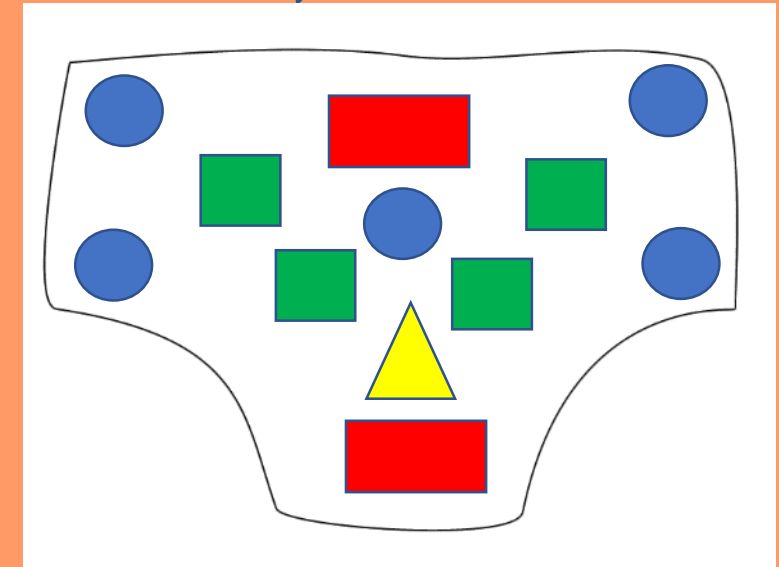
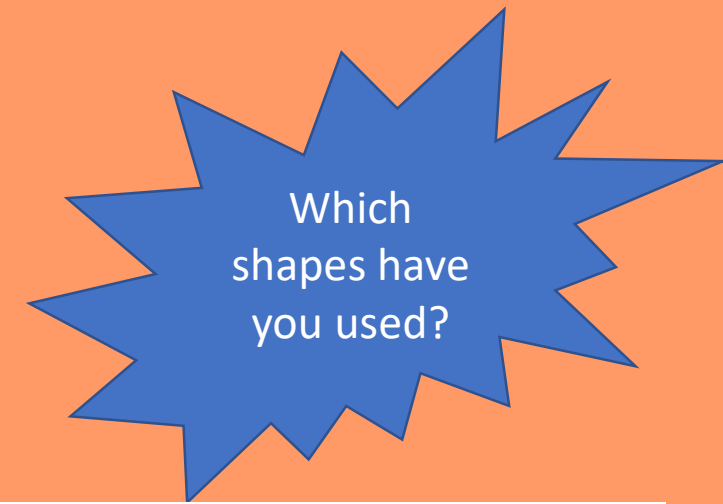
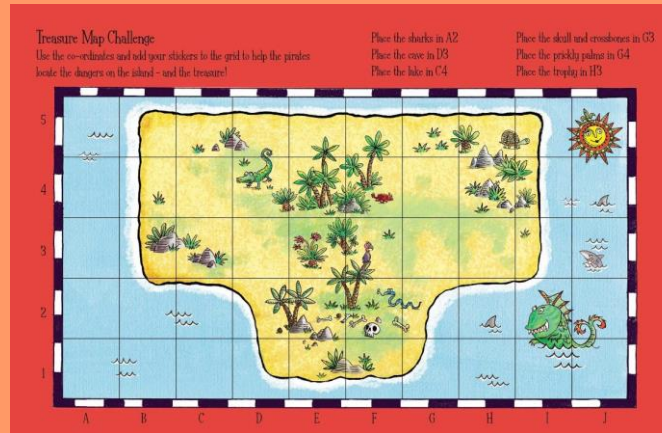
Maths: 2D shape sea creature

Learning objective:

Use and recognise different 2D shapes to make your underpants.

Steps to success:

- Cut out (with a grown up's help) or draw 2D shapes
- Use the shapes to decorate your underpants.
- Talk about the shapes you have used.
- Display your underpants!



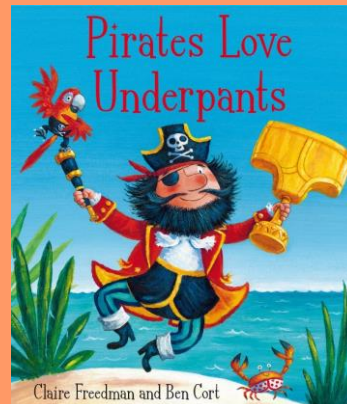
Creative: Scavenger Hunt

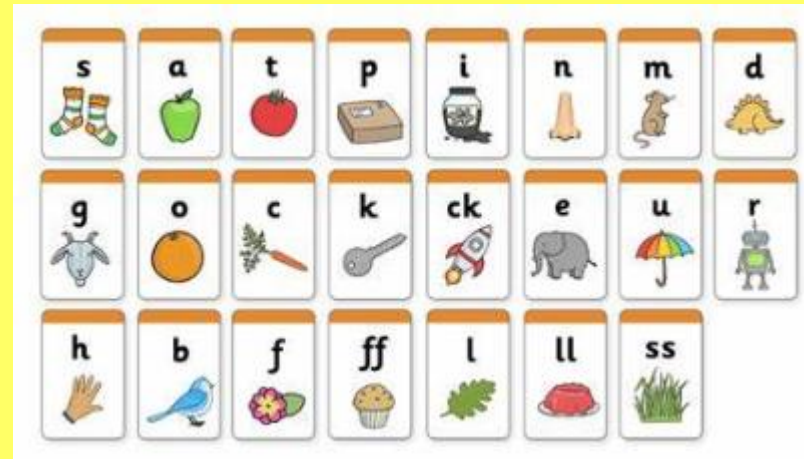

 b, j, f).

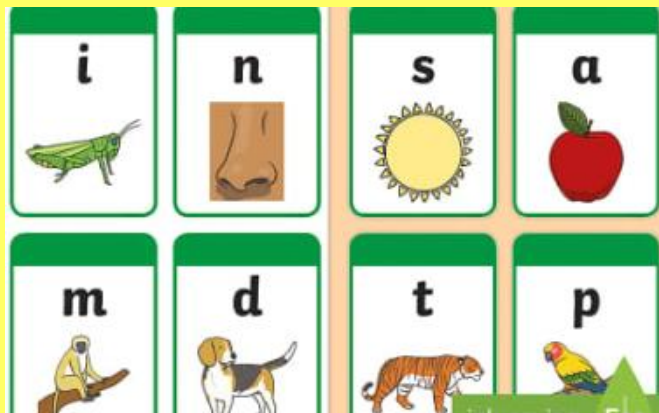
Learning objective:
