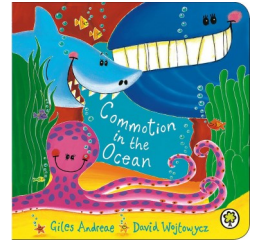


English

- Practise your letter formation. If you have a tablet, you could try using purple mash 2handwrite to have go at forming your graphemes with lead ins.
- Practise your tricky words.

Maths

- Ask your grown up to hide the numbers to 20 around your garden. See if you can find all 20 and place them in order. You could make it more challenging by getting your grown up to hide calculations that you need to solve.
- Do some baking at home with your grown up. After you have finished making your yummy treat, talk about sharing it equally or splitting it in to halves and quarters.
- Practise counting in 2's. Learn about even and odd numbers.

- Task 1- Imagine you have found a magic shell and you can have one wish. Draw a picture to show us what your wish would be.
- Task 2 - Talk to a grown up about how to stay safe around water. Maybe you could make a safety poster!
- Task 3 - Learn about the how damaging plastic and litter can be in our oceans. Make a sea creature out of recycled materials.
- Task 4 - Imagine you are in a submarine. What things can you see under the sea? Maybe you have discovered a mermaid. Make an underwater picture using any materials of your choice.
- Task 5 - Make up an under the sea dance or do some under the sea exercises in your house. Walk like a crab or wiggle like an octopus.
