English

Spelling & Reading

- Use the read, cover, write strategy to learn the words:
 bicycle, describe, forward, knowledge, particular, regular and various.
- Practise these spelling by putting them into interesting sentences.
- Read aloud to an adult, putting on different voices for each character.
- After reading to an adult, ask them questions about what you have read.



Maths

- In each room of your house (kitchen, living room, bedroom and any other room you choose), record how many items you see that are blue.
- Once you have recorded the numbers, go on to answer the following questions:
- 1. Which room had the most blue items?
- 2. Which room had the least blue items?
- 3. How many more/less did the kitchen have to the living room?
- 4. How many more did the room with the most blue items have compared to the room with the least?

You can repeat this investigation using different colours.

Make your own number to aid you with mental calculations.

Use the number grid to practise adding/subtracting the numbers: 9, 11, 19, 21, 29 and 31.
