

- Can you remember how to hold your pencil?












Steps to success:

Learning objective: Make a paper aeroplane and have a race looking at the number it landed in.


Steps to success:

- Using your fine motor skills fold card or paper to make paper aeroplanes with your family.
- Label your aeroplanes with your age. e.g. if you are four write 4 on your aeroplane.
- Create a large number line. This can be done outside with chalk or on pieces of paper.
- To make it fair make sure everyone stands at the start of your number line.
- Count 1,2,3, and on 3 everyone throws their aeroplanes.
- What number did yours land on?
- Whose flew the furthest?
- Who came 1st 2nd and 3rd?



Creative: Using books and a computer to find out information.


Learning objective: There are more than 60 lighthouses in the UK, use google earth to find some of them.

- Use books and the internet to find out the answers.



Phonics: All about your name Learning objective: Recognise the capital letter of your name.



Steps to success:

Maths: Sing the number song Ten Green Bottles. Learning objective: To understand one less.

- Steps to success:
- Recycle ten bottles.
- Fill the bottles with water half way (you can add a drop of green paint or food colouring to turn the water green).
- Label the bottles with numbers 1-10. You can use your number formation mat to help you.
- Go outside and line the bottles on a wall (you can also use a table).
- Order your bottle numbers 1-10.
- Using a ball or a bean bag can you throw it at a bottle to try and make it fall (try and aim for the number 10).
- When one has fallen down, you have one less. How many bottles do you have now?
- Repeat game until all the bottles have fallen down.

Learning objective: Make short bread and decorate with icing to make iced sea biscuits.

Steps to success: 1) Ask an adult to put the oven on 170C/150C fan/gas 3.

2) Wash your hands. Why do you need to wash your hands?

3) Measure the ingredients using scales. Do you recognise any numbers?

4) Put all ingredients into a bowl and use your hands to mix until it looks like breadcrumbs then squeeze until it comes together as dough. What does it feel like?

5)On a floured service roll the dough using a rolling pin. How has it changed?

6) Cut biscuits using a cutter. What shape are they?

7)Ask a adult to put them in the oven for 15-20 minutes until golden brown. Talk about safety.

8) Once completely cool decorate with icing sugar.


Learning objective: Make a diary of your week using pictures and initial sounds.

Steps to success:


- Listen to the story The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch.



Learning objective: Use different materials and one handed equipment to construct with a purpose in mind.






Steps to success:
