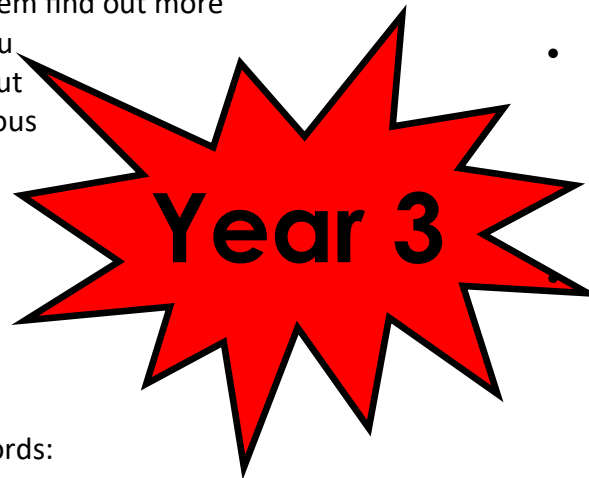


English

- Imagine you have time travelled back to ancient Greece. What kinds of things might you do? Use your new knowledge about life in ancient Greece to write a postcard about your time there. You can use the activity set as a To Do on Purple Mash this week to record your ideas.
- You are now an expert on life in ancient Greece. Use Purple Mash to create a leaflet that you could share with others to help them find out more information. Remember to show the things that you found most interesting. You could include facts about ancient Greek homes, ancient Greek weapons, famous battles and the Greek alphabet.



Spelling & Reading

- Use the read, cover, write strategy to learn the words: breath, different, forwards, learn, peculiar, reign and weight.
- Practise these spelling by putting them into interesting sentences.
- Read aloud to an adult, putting on different voices for each character.
- After reading to an adult, ask them questions about what you have read.



Maths

- Play the 'Yes/No' game with another person about different shapes. Ask different questions about the shape (only answering yes or no) to then guess what shape you are thinking of.
- Put the numbers 0-9 on different pieces of card and cut out. Turn them over and pick up 2 lots of 4 cards. Add and subtract the numbers you make.

Creative - Gods and Mortals

- Spot buildings influenced by Greek architecture around your nearest town or city, and take photographs that you could send to school. Hunt for columns, statues or pillars. Find out about different types of column (Doric, Ionic, Corinthian) and see if you can identify any of these on your hunt.
- Look at travel websites to find out about holidays to Greece. If you could go on holiday to one of the Greek islands, which one would you choose? Can you write a description of what you could see and do while you were there? Would you be able to see any remains from ancient Greece?
