### Geography Week

We have had a fantastic start this half term, looking at climate change and how pollution is affecting all of us. The children impressed us with their enthusiasm and hope for a better future!

#### English

During this half term's English, our classes will be looking at lots of exciting texts. We will:

- develop our rhyming and repetition skills when writing poems
- write our own mystery narrative in the style of 'Stig of the Dump'
- become Stone Age children and write a diary recount
- apply our new found knowledge to create a non-chronological report about the Stone Age



#### Maths

Children will continue to develop addition, subtraction, multiplication and division skills. During lessons we will be:

- adding two 3 digit numbers where exchanging is involved
- subtracting two 3 digit number where exchanging is involved
- recapping our 2 and 5 times tables
- dividing numbers by using equipment to help us group and share
- using practical equipment to help us multiply by 3, 4 and 8



#### Reading at home - Accelerated Reader

We are continuing to encourage the children to read their chosen book throughout the week in school and at home. In school, children will then complete a quiz on their chosen book to assess their understanding.

#### Times tables

Continue to use 'Times Table Rockstars' to practise rapid recall of multiplication and division facts.

#### Spelling

Please practise the Year 1/2 and 3/4 common spelling words from National Curriculum Appendix (please ask your teacher for a list if you are unsure).



# Tribal Tales



During this topic, children will explore Prehistoric Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age and find out how communities began.

They will become archaeologists for the day and carry out an archaeological dig to find artefacts. Back in class, they will use the artefacts to find out information about the past.

Using research skills, the children will find out information about different time periods and choose a method of presenting the information to interest others.

Remember to share the knowledge organiser with your child so that they are familiar with important vocabulary for this topic.

## Religious Education

Develop an awareness of different types of relationship, including marriage and those between friends and families.
