English

During this half term's English, our classes will be looking at lots of exciting texts.

Pupils will read Aesop's Fables and have the chance to write their own animal inspired fable.

Research information about a predator and choose how to present it to create our own fact-file.

We are then going to be using our skills to write and perform a villainous speech that includes the 5 Ps: pace, pitch, power, pause and punctuation.

After that, each class will be looking at animal poetry to create a poem with structure.

<u>Maths</u>

In our maths lessons we are now ready for the challenge of exploring and understanding place value.

Pupils will use practical equipment to make models of the numbers to show the value of each digit.

In class children will be comparing and ordering numbers using <, > and = symbols.

We will be adding and subtracting using formal written methods.



Reading at home - Accelerated Reader

In Year 3, children begin to use the Accelerated Reader Programme and they are encouraged to read their chosen book throughout the week. The children will then complete a quiz on their chosen book to assess their understanding.

<u>Times tables</u>

Children will now be able to practise their timetables through Times Table Rock Stars. This can be accessed at home using the login details given to the children.

Spelling

Please practise the common spelling words from National Curriculum that will be sent home during the second week of the autumn term.









Creative

Look out for a life size skeleton which will be visiting our classrooms to help us learn about the bones in the human body. Each class will work as a team to learn the names of the bones and how they fit together to construct a skeleton of our own. Next, the children will investigate the skeletons of other animals to find out how they are similar to a human skeleton and to identify any differences. Models will be built to show how muscles work to move the bones in our bodies.

Furthermore pupils will find out about the diets of different animals and what humans need to eat to keep us healthy. In our DT project children will select, measure, prepare and cook ingredients to make a healthy vegetable soup.

Finally an investigation will take place to show how water is transported through a plant, what seeds need to grow well and whether a plant can be a predator.



Religious Education
