MATHEMATICS

- Use mental and written strategies to solve addition and subtraction problems to 100.
- Explore 2-D and 3-D shapes.
- Make and add equal groups.
- At home, please practise counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s in preparation for learning our times tables.



- Explore rhyming words and alliteration within poetry.
- Apply time conjunctions (e.g. first, next, then) when writing instructions.
- Discuss how apostrophes are used for possession.
- Write our own narrative linked to George's Marvellous Medicine.



Reading reminders

There are two types of reading book that your child will bring home:

- A reading practice book. This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.
- A sharing book. Your child will not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

Muck, Mess and Mixtures

We are looking forward to starting our new Creative topic, Muck, Mess and Mixtures. We will be exploring lots of Art and Science throughout this topic.



- Work scientifically to investigate which mixtures create the 'best' bubbles.
- Identify the range of materials used to make everyday objects, investigating the properties of each and explaining the effectiveness of each material for its purpose
- Investigate and record how the shape of a range of materials can be changed by twisting, stretching, bending and squashing.
- Choose and prepare ingredients to make a healthy pizza.

PSHE - Me and my relationships

- Talk about behaviour and the impact this can have on others.
- Discuss how we can resolve conflicts.

RE - Valuing new life - The birth of Jesus

- Identify how stories and symbols can be used by religious communities to show the importance of new life.

PE

- Practise dribbling, hitting and kicking.
- Explore gymnastic skills.
