English

During this half term's English, our classes will be looking at lots of exciting texts. We will:



- develop our rhyming and repetition skills when writing poems
- write our own mystery narrative in the style of 'Stig of the Dump'
- become Stone Age children and write a diary recount
- apply our new found knowledge to create a non-chronological report about the Stone Age



Maths

Children will continue to develop their multiplication and division skills. During lessons we will be:

- use arrays to represent the times tables
- dividing numbers by using equipment to help us group and



- multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number using a formal written method
- using practical equipment to help us multiply by 3, 4 and 8

Reading at home - Accelerated Reader

We are continuing to encourage the children to read their chosen book throughout the week in school and at home. In school, children will then complete a quiz on their chosen book to assess their understanding.

<u>Times tables</u>

Continue to use 'Times Table Rockstars' to practise rapid recall of multiplication and division facts.

Spelling

Please continue to practise the Year 1/2 and 3/4 common spelling words from National Curriculum Appendix (please ask your teacher for a list if you are unsure).





<u> Tribal Tales</u>

During this topic, children will explore Prehistoric Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age and find out how communities began.



They will become archaeologists for the day and carry out an archaeological dig to find artefacts. Back in class, they will use the artefacts to find out information about the past.

Using research skills, the children will find out information about different time periods and choose a method of presenting the information to interest others.

Remember to share the knowledge organiser with your child so that they are familiar with important vocabulary for this topic.

Religious Education

Find out about ceremonies in which special moments in the life cycle are marked.



Develop an awareness of different types of relationship, including marriage and those between friends and families.



Practise tackling, passing and playing football, both as a defender and attacker.

French

Describe our likes and dislikes and learn about life in a French school.
