English


In school we will:

Creative Theme



Paws, Claws and Whiskers



Our topic is Paws, Claws and Whiskers where we will be learning about animals including humans and recognising the similarities and differences. Children will learn about the different animal groups and understand some key vocabulary such as carnivore, herbivore and omnivore.

D&T

Inventors get ready to explore a range of different style bridges and decide the best design for the Zoo. We will be designing a bridge to help the zoo keepers cross safely from one enclosure to another. Focusing on arch, beam and suspension bridge types.

RE

The theme this half term is

Celebrations. Exploring the different festivals and their preparations.

Art

Science
